


Dear friends,

I have seen all the works that are done under the sun; and indeed, all is vanity and grasping for the wind. Ecclesiastes 1:14

ave you ever tried to catch the wind in your fist? Go ahead, step outside, and grasp a handful. Now open your hand. What do you see? Nothing. It's all gone. That's what so much of our lives consist of: "vanity" and "grasping for the wind".

There was a time I didn't think that way. I chased the American lie—wealth, pleasure, power, influence, toys, and grandiose accomplishments. These, I thought, will make me happy, fulfilled, and looked up to. These will make me "someone important".

By my mid-thirties, I was grasping for all I could get. I owned my own business, five vehicles, and a 3000 squarefoot log home on forty park-like acres. I was head elder of the local church, active in over half a dozen sports, thrived on travel and recreation, and loved the party life.

But, oh, at what a cost! My health deteriorated, my marriage grew stale, my two boys hardly knew me, and my temper was on the rise. I found no genuine peace in any of it. All my hard-earned satisfaction vanished as quickly as the wind. It was sort of like eating potato chips. You can't eat just one, and when you've finished the whole bag, your gut aches.

### What's the bottom line?

I finally began to feel what Solomon expressed: "I hated life because the work that was done under the sun was distressing to me, for all is vanity and grasping for the wind." Ecclesiastes 2:17 I wondered what else there was. What does have lasting value? Eventually I arrived at the same bottom line that Solomon did. "Here is the conclusion of the whole matter: fear God and keep His commandments." (Ecclesiastes 12:13)

FRASPING

"Fear God"—that's character—a character restored to His likeness.<sup>1</sup> And "keep His commandments"—that's relationship—deep, lasting, transforming relationship with God and others.<sup>2</sup> That's the bottom line of life. All else is vanity and grasping for the wind.

So I woke up and sold our vehicles, our forty acres, our toys, and our business. We moved into a 960 square-foot log cabin in the quietness of the mountains of Montana. We began to experience the reality that "A little with peace is better than much in turmoil". Ecclesiastes 4:6 (Author's paraphrase.) A little with peace was our reward for cashing in our much in turmoil. I can't begin to tell you the benefits of a "little with peace". We began to find oneness with God and with each other.

So what's your bottom line? What are you spending your time and energy on? Are you grasping for the wind?

#### Without oneness with God, it's empty...

Many attend church, make assent to a platform of truth, give their tithes and offerings, and go on mission trips, but haven't learned how to abide in the Vine and receive His <u>life. They are like dried up branches—powerless over their</u>

hereditary and cultivated habits—possessing a form of godliness but lacking the fruits of the Spirit. How sad to gain all the head-knowledge and go through all the forms and motions without finding a daily, living experience in Jesus that brings depth to all our relationships! Yes, even church can become "vanity and grasping for the wind". Without oneness with God, it's empty!

I know men worth millions of dollars whose wives refuse to sleep with them. These men place a higher value on their trinkets, power, and influence than their wives—and their wives know it! What do they have? Nothing of lasting value. Nothing of real worth. Nothing but a fist-full of heartache.

# Character + Relationship = Substance

Do your children know you and do you know them? Or are you strangers living under the same roof? Why do we bring them into this world and then give little time to them while we chase "vanity and grasping for the wind"? Are your news programs, internet searches, sports, videos and TV of more value than your own flesh and blood? You see, what you invest your time in shows what you value the most. Our actions always speak louder than our words or our profession.

Why do we chase the low priorities of life while negating what really counts? Apparently we haven't reached Solobottom-line: mon's that character and relationship are all that truly matter in life; that is, the character of God reproduced in and through us in our daily lives—and spelled out in our marriages, families, friendships, churches,



and com-

munities. This is what life is about! This is the life I choose to grasp onto! This is the life of God's last day people who "keep the commandments of God and the faith of Jesus."<sup>3</sup>

### My Model

There was One that modeled this life. He is the Man I follow.

He was born in a stable, the child of a peasant woman.

3 Revelation 14:12

He worked in a carpenter shop until He was thirty. Then for three years He traveled from place to place on foot as a minister.

He never owned a home. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family. He never went to college. He never traveled two hundred miles from the place He was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. In other words, He never grasped for the wind. He had no credentials but His character. He pursued nothing but the Divine Purpose for which He was born.

While still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against him. Most of His friends deserted Him. One of them denied Him. Another betrayed Him and turned Him over to His enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial—a trial instituted by His own church. He was nailed upon a cross between two thieves. While He was dying His executioners gambled for the only piece of property He had on earth – His robe. When He was dead, He was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

# Less attempted more achieved

More than nineteen centuries have come and gone, and today He is the centerpiece of the human race and the One who connects us to God and each other.

I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed the seas; all the legislative bodies that ever set and all the

kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life.<sup>4</sup>

Here was a Man who illustrated what gives life genuine value!

What about you? What about me? What will we spend and be spent for? Will we seek to grasp the wind? Or will we follow Him? *elm*
